This call for papers covers how to submit an abstract, the requirements, and the ready-made template.

01 _ About the conference

Natural Sciences in the Modern World (ZDTF) is a national scholarly and practical conference founded by the Innovative Academy Research Support Center in 2022. Abstracts are currently accepted across 3 thematic tracks. Since 2022 it has released 61 volumes carrying 916 abstracts, and volume 5 is in progress. Proceedings appear twice a month in open access and every abstract is given a DOI through Zenodo — a permanent link that does not change. Abstracts are accepted in Uzbek, Karakalpak, Russian and English; no ORCID is required and the length is two to four pages. Every author receives an electronic certificate once published.

04 _ Submitting an abstract

There are four ways to send an abstract for publication — name the conference (ZDTF) when you do:

05 _ Editorial process

Once received, an abstract goes through the following stages. The author is notified at each one.

06 _ Technical requirements

File format	Microsoft Word (.docx) only. PDF and scans are not accepted
Font	Cambria or Times New Roman, size 12
Line spacing	1.15
Page	A4; margins: top/bottom 2 cm, left 3 cm, right 1.5 cm
Length	2–4 pages including the reference list
Abstract	60–100 words — recommended
Keywords	3–5 — recommended
References	up to 5 sources, APA 7
Originality	At least 60% (Copyleaks check)

07 _ Abstract structure

Lay the abstract out in this order. Do not change the template's styles — the system reads the text by them.

01	Abstract title	in the main language, upper case, on its own line
02	Author blocks	full name → institution or place of study → e-mail; each on its own line
03	Supervisor	if any — one line beginning with "Supervisor:"
04	Abstract and keywords	with the "Abstract:" and "Keywords:" labels, in the main language; the system supplies them if you do not
05	Body	relevance → method → result → conclusion
06	References	with its heading and a numbered list — the heading is required

08 _ Language rules

An abstract may be written in any of four languages. Title, authors and abstract are given in the language of the text; a translation is **not required**.

Language	At the top of the abstract	Extra translation
Uzbek	Uzbek title, authors, abstract, keywords	Optional
Karakalpak	Karakalpak title, authors, abstract, keywords	Optional
Russian	Russian title, authors, abstract, keywords	Optional
English	English title, authors, abstract, keywords	Optional

Do not change the labels (**Abstract:**, **Keywords:**, **Annotatsiya:**, **Kalit so'zlar:**) — the system reads them automatically.

09 _ Author formatting

Each author goes on a separate line. Where authors come from different institutions, the digit after the surname matches the institution's number.

Type the digit after the surname plainly (for example "Yusupov1") — the system turns it into a superscript.

10 _ Formulas, figures and tables

Equations

Typed in Word's equation editor (Insert → Equation). Equations pasted as images are not accepted. Equations referenced in the text are numbered on the right: (1).

Figures

Placed in line with text, at least 300 dpi.
A centred caption goes below each figure: "Figure 1. Title". Essential text must not be locked inside images.

Tables

Real Word tables only (not images). The caption goes above the table: "Table 1. Title". Every table, equation and figure must be referred to in the text.

11 _ References

References follow APA 7 and are **limited to five sources**. In-text citations go in square brackets: [1], [2]. The list is numbered under the heading "References" — **that heading is required**, as the system uses it to tell the body from the bibliography.
