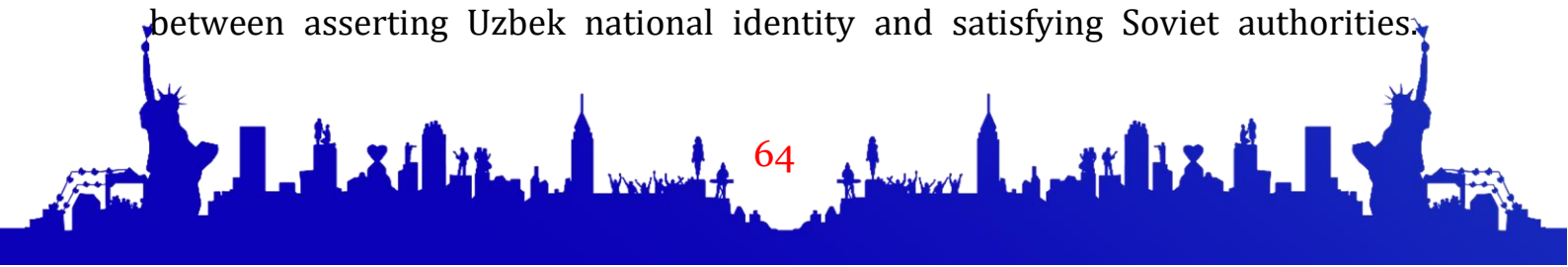

Through his balanced approach, he was able to achieve a high degree of autonomy and prosperity for Uzbekistan within the USSR system.

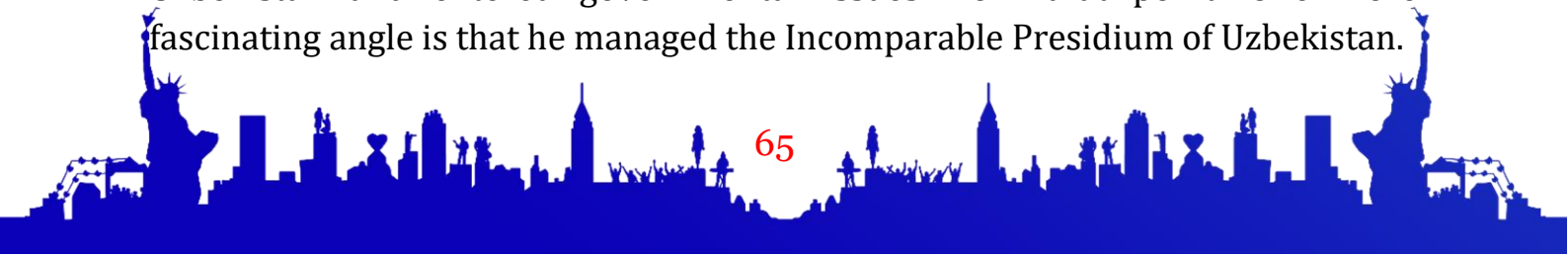

One more fascinating angle is that he managed the Incomparable Presidium of Uzbekistan.





Around then, he held the most elevated status (position) in Uzbekistan - the main secretary of the Socialist Faction of Uzbekistan. He was trailed by the Executive of the Committee of Pastors. In third spot was the director of the presidium.

Sharof Rashidov is from a group of craftsmen. Well known artist Hamid Olimjon was his cousin. As per Sharof Rashidov's diaries, on the day he was chosen as the main secretary, he got back home and awakened his kids. He told his kids: "Presently you ought to concentrate on well and be a model. Since, in such a case that there is no structure at home, there will be no organization outside. Everyone's attention is on you," he prompted. Around then, when his significant other said: "You have taken on an undeniably challenging undertaking", he answered: "They didn't let me, I will be here for 4-5 years and I will get back to my composition."

Sharof Rashidov generally needed to get back to composing. We saw this in the meetings given by his siblings. His fantasy was to resign and do really composing.

In summary, Sharof Rashidov's remarkable life story and career epitomize the tremendous accomplishments that can be achieved through strong, compassionate leadership.
