



## LINGUISTIC FEATURES OF YOUTH SPEECH IN THE KARAKALPAK LANGUAGE

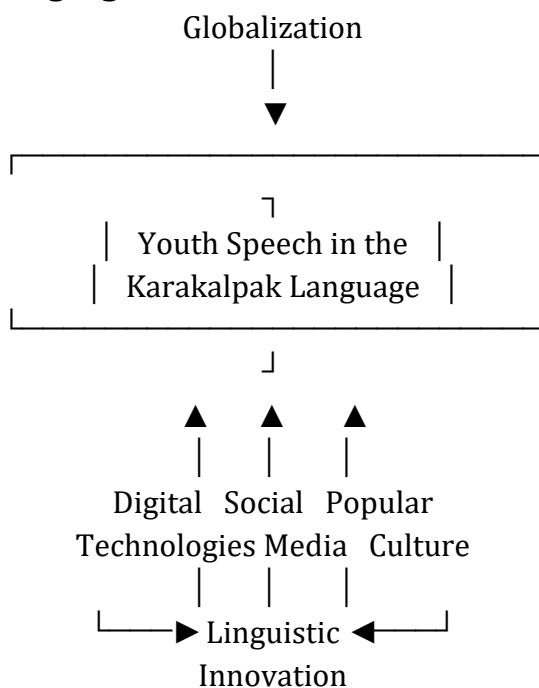

Social networking platforms, instant messaging applications, and online communities encourage the use of abbreviated forms, acronyms, emojis, and other innovative communicative strategies. The need for rapid communication often results in linguistic economy, leading speakers to shorten words and phrases without compromising meaning. Moreover, youth speech is characterized by a high degree of emotionality and expressiveness.
