Annotation

The impact of English on career opportunities extends beyond knowledge access. In sectors such as IT, finance, and healthcare, employees are often required to engage with international clients, documentation, and digital platforms, all of which predominantly operate in English. Consequently, the ability to communicate effectively in English is frequently associated with promotions, salary increments, and career stability. Despite its benefits, some researchers caution against overreliance on English, emphasizing the need to preserve local languages and cultural identity while leveraging English for global engagement [6; 84].
